Why have a BSD certificate?

- Break no-support myth
- Business adoption
- Standard objectives
- Help for HR
- Revaluation of IT professionals



Problems with traditional certs

- Made to sell software
- Made to sell trainings
- Expire to sell updates
- Test knowledge of tools, not of technique
- No input from examinees



Value for employers

- Cost is not the real problem
- Consensus
- Don't always believe the hype
- All BSDs based on evolution, not on revolution
 - -> good investment



Value for employers (continued)

- Relatively cheap
- Difficult
- BSDCG values community input -> regular update procedure
- Vendor-independent



Disadvantages

No practical test



Pros of certification for employees

- Extra asset
- Employer demand
- Compare yourself to others
- Confident about the future
- •
- Who needs a cert anyway?



Cons of a certification

- Time
- Money
- Risk of not passing
- Limit your own competences



How a test is created?

- Job task analysis (JTA)
- Exam objectives
- Now: paper based
- Later: test platform (free software!)



Cost of the exams

- NOCA certification: USD 35.000
- Vue/Prometric: USD 8.000/exam/version/language -> cooperation with LPI in Europe
- Development of own platform: USD 15.000
- Trademarks/copyrights: USD 4.000



What is tested? (general)

- Distribution independent -> test understanding, not memory capacity
 - Upgrade/install
 - Security
 - Data and file systems
 - User and group management
 - Basic system/network management
 - UNIX knowledge



Quality Assurance

- Psychometrics:
 - Questions are fair
 - Questions are accurate
 - No trick questions
 - Precise mesurement of knowledge



Quality Assurance (continued)

- Scientific methods for:
 - Scoring procedure
 - Passing score
 - Equality of different test versions
 - Rotation scheme
